From 2017 to 2021, he completed his **Bachelor's degree** in **Catholic Church Music** at the University of Catholic Church Music and Music Education in Regensburg. In autumn 2021, he began his artistic-pedagogical training there with a Bachelor's degree in **Instrumental Pedagogy** Organ, which he completed with distinction in 2024.

Since the summer semester of 2022, he has also been a **student lecturer** for early music accompaniment on organ and harpsichord at the same institution and since the the summer semester 2024 in a **teaching activity** for harpsichord. He is pursuing **parallel master's programmes** in organ and harpsichord.

Important stages of his concert activities at home and abroad have included collaborations with the German Music Council (Berlin) and, as part of his love of early music, the Bach Festival in Budapest.
